Submission to Parliament on Proposed Changes to Online Gambling

The Government is currently asking for submissions to its proposal to allow 15 online casinos to operate in New Zealand. Currently, the revenue from pokie machines must be redistributed back into the community. This is where we have got many of our grants from, e.g. \$15,000 for the chairs and \$2000 for the new computer. If this proposal goes ahead there will be less revenue from pokie machines, therefore

less money for sports and community clubs. Feilding Bridge Club has put in a submission in opposition to this proposal, along with many community groups and sports clubs.


