Championships and Pairs Events

Championship pairs and no more than **two** other pairs events may be played with the same partner. Championships are scored on a raw score.

Substitutes

In all pairs events only **one** substitute per pair, per competition shall be allowed. The senior championship events shall allow **one** substitute per person per pair. Double substitutes allowed. See also Championship Pairs.

N.B. Visitors may not be used as substitutes in club competitions.

Teams Events

The teams must be represented every night. Up to two substitutes are permitted in any one night in Open and Rotational Pairs competitions. Any player can be substituted once in the competition.

Rotational Teams

Players will be allocated to teams according to their national rating points.

Presidents Trophy (Monday)

This is an individual event inclusive of the Ladder Competition based on points (5, 4, 3, 2, 1) scored through the whole year on a handicap basis.

Thursday Rules

In order to be eligible to win the competition and to receive points towards the Presidents Trophy: -

- Juniors may play with anyone.
- · Intermediates and Open players **must** play with a Junior.

Presidents Trophy (Thursday)

This is an individual event inclusive of the Ladder Competition based on points (5, 4, 3, 2, 1) scored through the year on a handicap basis. See Thursday Rules above.

Restricted Pairs

The rules for Restricted Pairs are as follows:

- · Open players **must** play with a Junior.
- Intermediates with 80 rating points or more **must** play with a Junior.
- Intermediates with less than 80 rating points may play with another Intermediate with less than 80 rating points or a junior.

Corrick Cup (Monday)

To be awarded to the player who gains the most points (5, 4, 3, 2, 1) scored through the year on a raw score basis. To be awarded for competition pairs events excluding Ladder events.

Championship Pairs (Monday) C. Allardice Trophy

All **six** nights count. Visitors may NOT play on championship nights. If both players of a pair are away on the same night, they are ineligible. Please refer to substitutes.

Championship Pairs (Thursday)

All **four** nights to count. Visitors may NOT play on championship nights. Only Junior ranking players at the start of the calendar year are eligible to play. Any substitutes must be Junior ranking players.

The Doug Gollan Memorial Trophy (Monday)

All players on a plus handicap at the beginning of the year are eligible, the winner being the one who reduces his/her handicap the most. A minimum of 20 nights must be played in the year.

The Cora Ewart Memorial Trophy (Thursday)

For players in first, second or third year on play over a minimum of 20 nights on points (5, 4, 3, 2, 1) scored through the year on a raw score basis. To be won once only.

The Taylor Trophy (Monday)

All players on a 0 to -5 handicap at the beginning of the year are eligible. To be awarded to the player whose handicap has improved the most at the end of the year.

Ladder Events

To be played over 3 or 4 nights. Each night to be played with a different partner with whom you have not played a competition on that particular night in the previous year. The winner has the highest average handicap score.

Harry Allardice Memorial Trophy

Best all-round Friday player, based on attendance, playing with the most partners and C points earned.

Bill Towler Cup

Winner of the Swiss Pairs.

Club Ethics and Etiquette for all members

Acts to be carefully avoided:

- A remark, gesture, question, or mannerism which might convey information to your partner or mislead an opponent.
- A bid or play made with emphasis, undue haste, or unreasonable delay, when the act might convey information to your partner or might mislead your opponents.
- Loud discussion about the hands, once played, that could be overheard by players at the next table and may create an advantage to players who have not yet played that board.

A player should refrain from:

- Frequent review of the auction due to his/her own inattention.
- Volunteering information which should be given only in response to a question.
- Making gratuitous remarks during or at the end of play as to the auction or adequacy of the contract.
- Detaching a card from his/her hand before his/her turn to play.

Please note the following:

The Director should be called for ALL infringements or questions during play. The Director's decision is final. Right of appeal may be exercised.

A reasonable standard of dress and footwear is required.

The Play

During Play

- · West is in charge for moving the boards on.
- · East checks scores with South.
- · West moves on as soon as time indicates.
- North is responsible for seeing that West moves boards on correctly.

End of Play

 North and West are responsible for putting the boards away and tidying up the table, emptying the rubbish bin by the table, pushing the chairs in, opening the venetian blinds and turning off the heat pumps.

Visitors

Visitors are welcome to play in Summer and Winter Wednesday Bridge sessions. Visitors not affiliated with any club may play two nights (days) of club competitions, excluding championships, and members of other clubs may play four nights (days) of club competitions, excluding championships, in a year without becoming a financial member of our club.

Handicapping

- Players changing to Monday from Thursday will be given a handicap of +5. Novices will be given a +8.
- 2. Players from other Clubs:

Graded Junior + 4 Graded Intermediate 0 Graded Open - 4

With provision for the Committee to adjust the handicap if the player is better than average (based on National Ranking). These handicaps remain effective for nine nights.
